**MINUTES**

**FROM CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION BOARD MEETING THAT WAS HELD ON**  
**Thursday February 11, 2021, Victim Compensation Office.**

The Crime Victim Compensation Board members, Anna Elders , Sandra Figueroa & Jessei MacIntire Victim Advocate Coordinator and Elvira Talavera victim advocate were timely, present, and ready for the presentation of business.

The Crime Victim Compensation Board members were presented with facts of each case. These facts were obtained by each individual police reports then presented to the board members by Jessei MacIntire, Graham County Attorney's Victim/Witness Advocate along with supported documentation (Cost estimate of the Victims Dental Expenses) for each request of compensation. - 1) Meeting called to order at 8:35 am by Jessei MacIntire

**II: Introduction of new business:**

- 1) Claim # 31760-1 Asking for reimbursement for Dental Repair on an assault case for the amount of \$1622.40 to Bull Dental Office; Victim paid \$20.80 out of Pocket for a complete total to be paid= \$1643.20.

1<sup>st</sup> motion to be made to approve payment was made by Anna Elders.

2<sup>nd</sup> motion to be made to approve payment was made by Sandra Figueroa.

**III: ON-GOING CLAIMS:**

- 1) #16129 and #16130 -Approval of 6 additional mental health sessions. Board members inquired on the time limit on mental health issues. Advised Board members that the victim representative was advised that if further counseling was needed that the board was willing to pay for six (6) additional sessions. Board members advised that the representative believed that at this time the victims seemed to be fine and that the victim

representative felt that no additional session were necessary. Board members discussed if defendant could have a stipulation put in place as to counseling that may need to be addressed in the future; should the need arise from the Victims. Victim Advocate Coordinator Jessei MacIntire to inquire and look to see if there was a time frame on how long a claim can be left open for additional claims for counseling therapy in the near future.
